Arrival and ticket information

When you arrive you'll need to register with your e-ticket at the registration point. **Please ensure that you have your own ticket on you ready for scanning before you arrive at the venue.** This must have your **full name** on, and not reserve student details.

The events can be quite busy so try to make sure you've got all the information you need from your teacher before you arrive, including how to contact them and where to meet at the end of the day if you're travelling as part of a group.

Timetable and planning your day

There are six session slots through the day. Presentations range from general information about Oxford and Cambridge, to subject specific sessions and you can attend **any combination** of these sessions. You do not need to attend all the sessions and students usually **attend 3 or 4 sessions** in total of a mixture of general and subject specific talks. We recommend looking at the timetable before the conference and planning your day to factor in time for visiting the admissions stands and taking a lunch break during the gap in your chosen sessions as there is **no allocated lunch break**. Travel information

Parking: Free car parking is available at Lagan Valley Island for up to 250 vehicles. Four large tour buses can be accommodated on site, and other buses may need to find alternative parking. Details of additional parking options can be found [here](#).

Lunch break

There is **no allocated lunch break**. You can take your lunch break during sessions 3 or 4. We recommend you factor this in when planning your day and choosing which sessions to attend.

Event close
